19/09/18 - Community information, Albrighton

Missing: Nicole Harris 15 years Old

Police searching for missing Telford girl Nicole Harris have released a CCTV image of her.

15 year old Nicole was last seen in Albrighton on Saturday (15 September). CCTV shows her at the junction of High Street and Lyncroft just after 10pm on Saturday night. Shortly before the last sighting of her on CCTV she is seen at the entrance to the Shrewsbury Arms pub.



Officers are becoming increasingly concerned for her welfare and are appealing for the public's help to find her.

Although the last sighting of Nicole is in Albrighton, it's thought she could have been given a lift to be anywhere in the region.

Detective Inspector Lee Holehouse said: "It's been almost five days that Nicole was last seen and we're becoming increasingly concerned. She has not made contact with any of her family or people she knows since Saturday night and clearly the longer she is missing the more we are concerned for her safety.

"It may be someone has stopped and given her a lift and I would ask anyone who was driving through Albrighton on Saturday evening to get in contact, particularly anyone who has dashcam footage as they may have driven past her without realising."

Nicole is described as white, around 5ft 3 inches tall, slim build, with long straight dark brown hair and brown eyes. It's believed she was wearing a yellow vest top, a blue tracksuit top, blue jeans with flowers on and blue Adidas trainers at the time of her disappearance.

18/09/18 - Criminal damage, Birchmeadow Estate, Broseley

Tyres slashed on a parked car on the Birchmeadow Estate in Broseley overnight 16th to 17th September 2018.

Unknown offenders have committed criminal damage overnight to the tyres of a parked car in a residential estate.

On Monday the 17th of September it was reported to the Police that two front tyres on a car parked on the Birchmeadow Estate had been damaged by a bladed article. The criminal damage was caused sometime between 6pm on Sunday the 16th and 7am on Monday the 17th of September 2018.

Checks are being conducted with households in the area to see if the offence has been captured on CCTV.

The Safer Neighbourhood Team are keen to speak to any witnesses in the area overnight who may have seen anybody in the area acting suspiciously. 

West Mercia Police Launch Knife Surrender campaign on Tuesday 18th September 2018.

Knives and other bladed articles can be surrendered at a number of Police Stations.

In September, Warwickshire Police and West Mercia Police are supporting the national on-going knife surrender campaign, Operation Sceptre. The campaign will run for one week starting on Tuesday the 18th of September 2018.



The aims of the operation are to remove dangerous weapons from the street, reduce knife crime and raise awareness of the dangers and consequences of carrying a knife.

The Warwickshire and West Mercia policing areas do not have a big knife crime problem but we have seen the impact knife crime can have on victims and their families and the wider community.

Knife surrender bins will be located at the following police stations:

Hereford, Kidderminster, Leamington Spa, Nuneaton, Telford, Redditch, Rugby, Shrewsbury, Stratford-upon-Avon, Worcester

Anyone can use one of these bins to anonymously surrender a knife or other bladed item.

This is a surrender campaign as opposed to an amnesty, as there will be no immunity from prosecution should information come to light that one of the surrendered weapons may have been used in the commission of an offence.

17/09/18 - West Mercia PCC and Worcestershire council come together to tackle road safety

Police and Crime Commissioner John Campion and Worcestershire County Council are giving members of the public the ownership to improve the safety of their roads as part of a joint campaign.

Last weekend, at Sander's Park in Bromsgrove, both organisations asked the county's residents to let them know where they want the focus to be as part of the 'Roads Focus' campaign. The Commissioner and council want to give the public ownership to highlight where their concerns are. Be it installing white gates at the entrance of a rural village, putting up more signs to highlight young or elderly people crossing, introducing speed enforcement in a village or asking for other measures to discourage speeding.

During a week of action, which will take place in November, the Commissioner and the council will start implementing some of the changes that have been suggested by the public.

Over the course of the campaign, more work will be carried out to improve the safety of Worcestershire's roads and general road safety advice will also be given to ensure people remain focused when using the road - be it as a driver or pedestrian.

PCC John Campion said: "I am committed to improving road safety, which is why I am pleased to be working with Worcestershire County Council on this very important issue. With this campaign, we want to start by asking people where they have concerns. We hope to resolve some of those and see more people feeling safer within the communities they live in and on the roads they use."

Councillor Alan Amos, Cabinet Member with responsibility for Highways at Worcestershire County Council said: "The safety of Worcestershire roads is one of our top priorities as a council, and working together with the Police and Crime Commissioner, we're looking forward to making our highways a better place for all road users. This campaign is an opportunity for us to get the views of local residents to identify potential hazards, enabling us to identify areas for improvement across the county, subject to funding and resources available."

17/09/18 - PCC encourages more to take up offer of Smartwater

For the attention of all Parish Councils and Neighbourhood Watch Coordinators and other interested parties.

In a bid to reduce crime and build a safer West Mercia, Police and Crime Commissioner John Campion is calling on more councillors to supply crime deterrent Smartwater in their area.

Back in June, the Commissioner announced his '**We Don't Buy Crime - Leading From the Front**' project, which seeks to reduce acquisitive crime throughout West Mercia, and offered to contribute 25% of the cost for councillors looking to supply Smartwater in their area.

Smartwater, a water-based solution that is unique to each bottle, allows property to be marked and enables the police to

identify the owner of the property, and potentially the offender. Councillors were also offered free signage to let offenders know that if they commit crime in this area then they are likely to get caught and not profit from their crime.

John Campion said: "So far, I have had six councillors put in an application for Smartwater which would cover approximately 3,500 homes. It would be great to add even more homes to the 30,205 that are already protected with Smartwater. We have already seen great successes with Smartwater proving to work, and I would like to see this continue across the rest of our communities.

"Many people that have used Smartwater, and are now living in a **'We Don't Buy Crime'** town, are feeling more reassured and commented on how there is now a more enhanced community spirit.

"This offer will not only contribute to reducing crime but it will provide a further opportunity for us all to work together and make our communities feel safer."
